Preamble

We as Indians by the right of discovery of the incomplete Acts of Secularization of the missions in the State of California, who's authorized existence and termination can only be the secularization of the Indians residing in California, claim to be civilized in such manners as communicating in full knowledge of political, economic, and religious sciences of this society.
