To command the local reverend in each of the missions in upper and lower California a welcome and a cordial invitation to come and receive our (Indian) inheritance for becoming civilized.

ARTICLE II

To command the local reverend in each of the missions in upper and lower California to relinquish the administrative system, books, records, plats, authenticated or unauthenticated maps, collected under the functions of a mission for the secularization of the Indian.

ARTICLE III

To command the local reverend in each of the missions in upper and lower California to make an accounting of all monies and revenues due us (Indians) according to the provisions of the Secularization Acts beginning with January 30, 1851 to the present and further to make an accounting of all schools, universities, farms, cattle, and horticultural implements, which may have been purchased with the revenues and monies belonging to the Indians under the Secularization Acts.

Article 1

To command the local reverend in each of the missions in Upper and Lower California a welcome and cordial invitation to come and receive our (Indian) inheritance for becoming civilized.

Article 2

To command the local reverend in each of the missions in Upper and Lower California to relinquish the administrative systems, books, platts, authenticated or unauthenticated maps, collected under the function of a mission for the secularization of the Indian.

Article 3

To command the local reverend in each of the missions in Upper and Lower California to make an accounting of all monies and revenues due us (Indians) according to the provisions of the Secularization Act beginning with January 30th, 1851 to the present and further to make an accounting of all schools, universities, farms, cattle and horticultural implements which may have been purchased with the revenue and monies belonging to the Indians under the Secularization's Acts.
