

## WHAT IS AN INDIAN

What is an Indian? What is a White Man? What is a Black, Yellow, or Brown Man? The question is not land rights of the white man, but the category of laws that the Indian uses to protect his personal and land rights from.

It is the Indian that has great difficulty in enforcing his treaty rights, that the white man court system has tried so hard to protect. But still, an Indian when born, is also well defined.
