dead after the Battle of
Wounded Knee, December
1890. The inscription written
at the bottom of the picture
states that this is the Indian
who fired the first shot, but
reputable historians say that
no one person was identified
as the first man to shoot.

Here is a picture of the alleged Indian that was to have fired
the First shot that started the Wounded Knee Massacre in December 1890.

Can you imagine an Indian firing his Rifle, then lean on his weapon,
put is hand over his brow, to see if he missed or hit what he was shooting
at.

Just like the picture of BIG FOOT, which history records died of
hemorrhaging by his tent. The picture shows no tent, no blood, and the
position in death shows he was trying to get up, but from his wounds and
cold, froze to death. The bullet in his head came after he was dead and
the following day.

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
